The work given in this pack continues to aid your child's learning, with your support. Please continue to check over their work and discuss any mistakes and/or areas of difficulty. Listed below are the learning outcomes for literacy for the week beginning Monday 4th May (note bank holiday Friday 8th May).

Literacy

Weekend news- continue to write about some of the exciting things you have been doing at home! Continue to add detail and check punctuation.

- 'dd' sound related to spellings- (circle the sound in the story and complete spellings)
'dd' sound can be written duck/add/called

I have added a spelling test template if you want to print off and use on test day. There are two groups based on number facts, choose relevant PDF.

Please use the PowerPoint presentation to introduce 'dd' sound and complete the word sort activity included. Your child could either complete the word sort on the PowerPoint using a piece of paper and headings 'dd/d/ed. Or, your child could cut and sort the words in separate 'Word sort' PDF.

-Plural rules- children to complete activities related to plural rules. Plural rules are outlined on cover page of activities. There is a PowerPoint presentation that will revise the simple plural rules i.e. add s or es. It will also introduce the more difficult plural rules such as changing y to i and add es and f-ves. Complete the related activities for each rule.

To check if your child has understood the rules you could use the Plenary PowerPoint presentation and/or additional plural activities.

-Topic writing- Our new topic is 'The Seaside'. We will be learning about 'Grace Darling' using the link <https://www.bbc.com/teach/class-clips-video/history-ks1-ks2-grace-darling/z4y7pg8>. and/or PowerPoint presentation. Recall the story of Grace Darling and discuss the differences and similarities of then and now (different clothes/rowing boats/candle light). Discuss the bravery Grace showed rowing to save the sailors in the water. The children will write a character description of Grace, including what she was famous for and why.
